RCMP UPDATE CPL. K.A. HALL Corporal K.A. Hall, RCMP Crime Reduction Unit, provided Council with an update on the mandate of the Crime Reduction Unit and police matters in Castlegar and surrounding area. Corporal Hall shared the Corners Report concerning fentanyl-detected in illicit drug overdose deaths between January 1, 2012 – April 30, 2016.

MR. M. MURPHY BDO CANADA LLP RE: 2015 ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT The City's independent auditor, Mr. Michael Murphy of BDO Canada LLP, attended Council to present the 2015 Annual Financial Report. Mr. Murphy explained that the audit is conducted using Canadian Generally Accepted Accounting Standards as established by the Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB).

Mr. Murphy highlighted that the City of Castlegar contaminated sights program was complete and that no contaminated sites have been identified as a concern.

Mr. Murphy read the auditors report which stated the auditor's opinion of the financial statements; "the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the City at the year ended December 31, 2015." Mr. Murphy stated that with this audit letter the City has received "a clean audit report."

Mr. Murphy pointed out that the City has \$6.7 million in net financial assets. This is a very strong indicator of the City's financial strength and ability to maintain its infrastructure assets. Mr. Simpson also noted that expenditures are on budget and the City has very healthy reserves compared to other municipalities.

1. The Council of the City of Castlegar recommends the proposed amendment of the licence for The Thirsty Duck Pub Ltd to allow the following hours of liquor sales:

Monday through Saturday - 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. Sunday - 9:00 a.m. to Midnight.

This decision was based, in part, on consultation with the R.C.M.P.

- 2. The Council of the City of Castlegar's comments on the prescribed considerations are as follows:
- (a) The potential for noise if the application is approved

Since the pub is located in an industrial area, noise impact would be minimal.

(b) The impact on the community if the application is approved;

Since the business is located in an industrial area, there is minimal impact on the immediate vicinity.

(c) If the amendment may result in the establishment being operated in a manner that is contrary to its primary purpose.

Since the pub is located in an industrial area and also has a liquor primary licence, noise, nuisance and neighbourhood impacts would be minimal. The Council of the City of Castlegar had supported the identical hours of liquor sales for their liquor primary licence at the May 16, 2016 regular Council meeting.

3. The Council of the City of Castlegar's comments on the views of the residents are as follows:

A notice of proposed amendment to the Liquor Licence for the Thirsty Duck Pub was posted at 4370 B Minto Road. In addition, an advertisement was posted on the City of Castlegar notice board and on the City's website.

No comments/concerns were received at City Hall.
