that Council issue Development Variance Permit DVP-2/16 to A&W in order to vary Table 8.3.1 (a) of Zoning Bylaw 800, which stipulates that animated signs are prohibited. Doing so would permit an animated sign subject to the following conditions:

- 1. that the sign not be located closer to the front lot line than the existing, non-animated sign that it would replace; and
- 2. that the applicant address any concerns brought forward by the British Columbia Ministry of Transportation or the City's Transportation and Civic Works department.

- 2. that Castlegar City Council, pursuant to section 16 of the Community Charter authorizes the Director of Development Services, the Building Official and the City's Environmental Consultant to enter on 1067 Columbia Avenue for the purpose of conducting a hazardous and regulated materials pre-demolition assessment report and;
- 3. that once a hazardous and regulated materials pre-demolition assessment report has been completed Castlegar City Council, pursuant to Section 16 of the Community Charter, authorizes contractors who intend to submit a bid to do work that Council has directed to be done on the property pursuant to S. 17 of the Community Charter, accompanied by the Director of Development Services, the Building Official and a member of the RCMP, to enter on 1067 Columbia Avenue for the purpose of conducting a pre-demolition site inspection.
