Bylaw 1179

This version of this bylaw is a consolidation of amendments to the original bylaw as of the date specified. This consolidation is done for the convenience of users and accurately reflects the status of this bylaw as of the specified date of this consolidation but must not be construed as the original bylaw and is not admissible in Court unless specifically certified by the Corporate Officer for the City of Castlegar. Persons interested in the definitive wording of this bylaw and its amendments should view the original bylaws at the City of Castlegar.

CASTLEGAR

A bylaw to implement the Municipal Ticketing Information (M.T.I.) System

WHEREAS the Community Charter empowers the City, by bylaw, to designate those bylaws for which Municipal Ticket Information may be used as a means of bylaw enforcement;

AND WHEREAS the Community Charter empowers the Council, by bylaw, to authorize the use of any word or expression on a Municipal Ticket Information to designate an offence against a bylaw;

AND WHEREAS the Council deems it expedient to authorize the use of Municipal Ticket Information for the enforcement of certain bylaws, to authorize the use of certain words or expressions to designate certain bylaw offences, and to set certain fine amounts;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Castlegar, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

TITLE

1. This bylaw may be cited as "Municipal Ticket Information Bylaw Number 1179, 2013".

BYLAW CONTRAVENTIONS

2. The bylaws and bylaw contraventions designated in Schedule "B" to this bylaw, as amended from time to time, may be enforced by means of a ticket in the form prescribed for the purpose pursuant to Chapter 26, Part 8, Division 3, of the Community Charter.

BYLAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

3. The persons appointed to the job positions or titles listed in Column 2 of Schedule "A" to this bylaw are designated as Bylaw Enforcement Officers pursuant to Chapter 26, Part 8, Division 3, Section 264, 1(b) of the Community Charter for the purpose of enforcing the bylaws listed in Column 1 of Schedule "A" opposite the respective job positions.

OFFENCE AND PENALTY

4. Pursuant to section 265, 1(a) of the *Community Charter*, the amounts appearing in Schedule "B1" are the fine amounts set for each corresponding offence outlined. **(Bylaw 1419)**
5. Pursuant to section 265, 1(a) of the *Community Charter*, the amounts appearing under Column 3 of Schedules "B2" to "B18" are the fines set for the corresponding offences designated in Column 2 of each Schedule." **(Bylaw 1419)**

6. Pursuant to section 265, 2(a) of the *Community Charter*, If the fine is paid on or before the 30th day from the date on which the ticket is served, the dollar amounts in Column 4 of Schedules "B2" through "B18" of this Bylaw, if applicable, are the fines for the corresponding offence(s) defined in Column 2 of Schedule "B2" through "B18". **(Bylaw 1419)**
7. Any person who violates any provision of this Bylaw, or who causes, permits or allows any act or thing to be done in violation of this Bylaw, or who neglects to or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any provision of this Bylaw, is guilty of an offence against this Bylaw and each day that a violation continues is deemed to be a separate offence against this Bylaw. **(Bylaw 1419)**

DISPUTE A MUNICIPAL TICKET

8. Pursuant to section 267 1(b) of the *Community Charter*, the person on whom the ticket is served may, within 14 days after the date of service, dispute the allegation contained in the ticket by following the procedure as outlined on the ticket." **(Bylaw 1419)**

SEVERABILITY

9. If discrepancies exist between this Bylaw and any other City of Castlegar Bylaw, this bylaw shall prevail. **(Bylaw 1419)**
10. If any portion of this Bylaw is held to be invalid by a court or competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Bylaw. **(Bylaw 1419)**
11. Any referenced statutes, regulations, bylaws, policies, positions, titles or ministries, that are from time to time amended, replaced or succeeded by, shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Bylaw. **(Bylaw 1419)**

REPEAL

The City of Castlegar Bylaw Number 731 cited as "Municipal Ticketing Bylaw No. 731, 1995" and all amendments thereto, is hereby repealed.
